Housing and Services

This year, our Housing and Services initiative took off at full speed. We hired a community liaison in the Hood River / The Dalles region, identified key organizational and leadership partners, and developed our Circles of Care programming. The focus of Circles of Care is to ensure older adults have access to volunteer services that support them as they age which, in turn, strengthens communities. Older adults feel supported and may have opportunities to support others in ways that would otherwise seem impossible.

AGE+ is honored to announce that we were awarded continued funding over the next two years to help support our Housing and Services initiative. This generous funding from the Meyer Memorial Trust will propel our community building work, affordable housing development. community asset mapping and Circles of Care programming to grow in more rural communities. It will also allow us to engage in predevelopment activities for building an innovative housing model to support older adults in the Columbia River Gorge area of Oregon.

We look forward to lending our expertise to them as they work to serve grandfamilies across Oregon.
